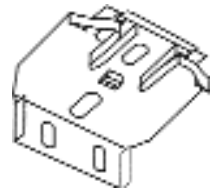


BASICS

A few simple tools are required:

- Measuring tape
- Power drill, drill bits
- Hex head and/or Phillips driver bit
- Pencil

Additional fasteners other than those sent with your shade may be required depending on the mounting surface. Wallboard and plaster require the use of anchors such as expansion or toggle bolts. Brick, tile or stone need special plugs and drill bits. Remember to always pre-drill holes in wood to avoid splitting.



Standard and Top-Down Bottom Up Installation Bracket



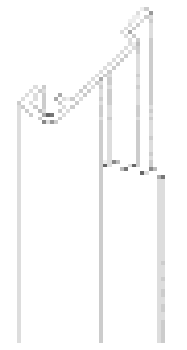
Continuous Loop Installation Bracket



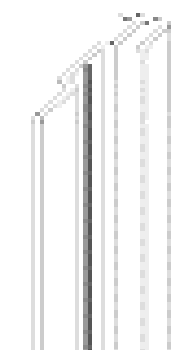
Bugle Head or Dry Wall Screw

Attachment Track

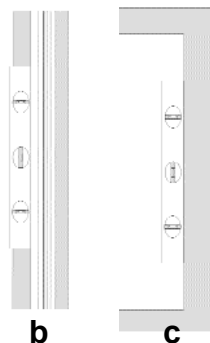
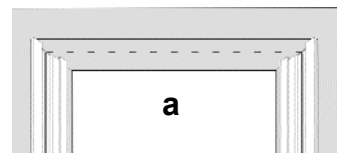
1 SIDE TRACK INSTALLATION

The minimum required depth for installation is 1 1/2". The minimum depth required for Flush mount installation is 1 7/8".

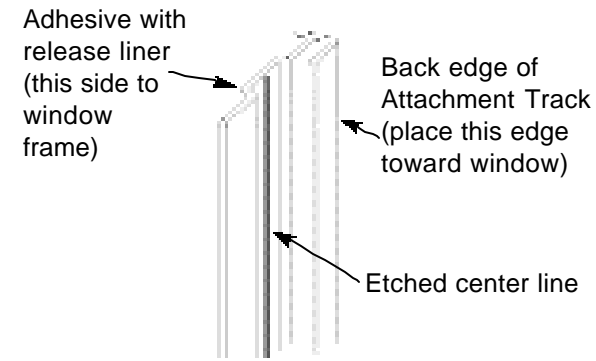
Mark the desired location for the side track.

On a shallow mount, align the front edge of the Attachment Track to the front of the window frame. For a Flush mount, the front edge of the Attachment Track should be placed 3/8" back from the front of the window frame. The track may be recessed further, but keep in mind that there must be a minimum of 1/4" between the back of the Attachment Track and any obstruction.

Tracks must be mounted, parallel to each other, with centers aligned(a), straight(b), and plumb(c). Make sure that the mounting surface is straight and plumb. Shim the attachment tracks if necessary.



Peel the paper liner from the back of the Attachment Track to expose the adhesive. Attach the Attachment Track to the window frame. Secure the track in place by installing a screw along the etched center line every 18".

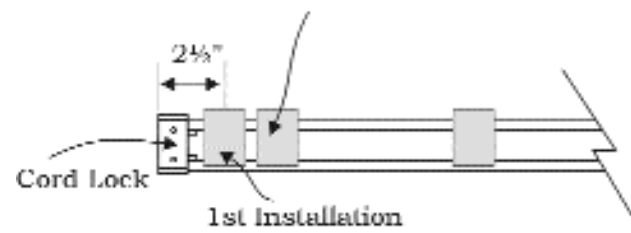


2 BRACKET INSTALLATION

Shades are shipped with the required number of brackets for proper installation. End brackets should be located with centerlines 2 1/2" in from each end. Depending on the width of the shade, additional brackets may be necessary evenly spaced between the two end brackets.

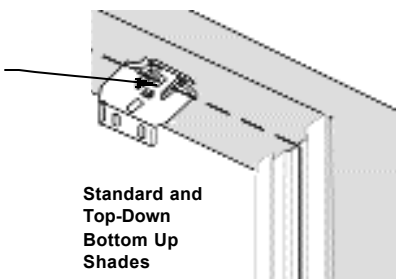
For shade widths of:	Use this Number of brackets:
Up to 40"	2
40" - 72"	3
72" - 84"	4
84" and up	5

On shades 84"-96" wide it is recommended to use a second bracket located next to the end bracket at the Cord Lock.



IMPORTANT:

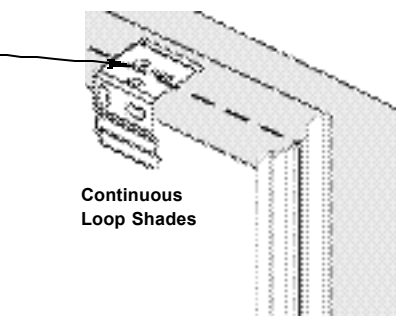
Standard Brackets must be installed so that the center of the front screw hole is in line with the etched center line on the Attachment Track.

IMPORTANT:

Continuous Loop Brackets must be installed so that the back of the left front slotted screw hole is in line with the etched center line on the Attachment Track.

3 SHADE INSTALLATION

Standard and Continuous Loop

Unwind the cord from the shade. Bring the top rail up near the installation brackets. Center the shade in the window opening and attach the headrail to the installation brackets.

Standard Brackets

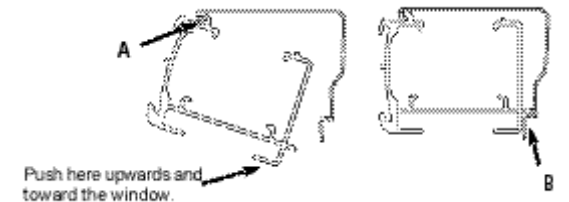
Insert the front clip of the installation bracket into the front groove of the rail.



Push the rail back and up until the back clips of the bracket are inserted in the back groove of the rail.

Continuous Loop Brackets

Position the headrail with the front lip (A) resting on the top hooks of all brackets. Make sure no fabric is pinched between the bracket and headrail.



Push the bottom of the headrail firmly upwards and toward the window until the groove at the bottom of the headrail snaps into place, (B) as shown.

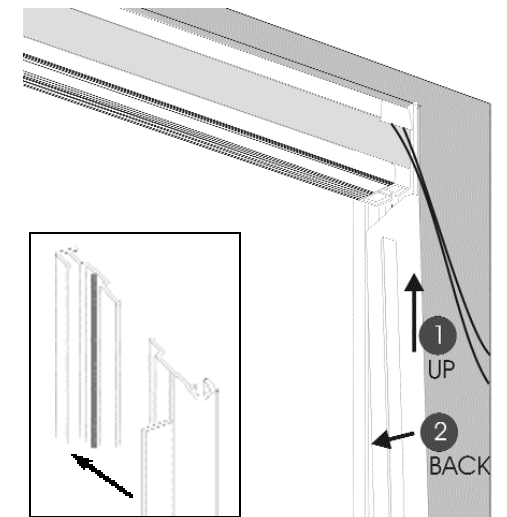
Side Track Rails

Select the Side Track Rail that will be installed on the control side of the shade. The notch on the Track must be on the top.

Slide the T of the Side Track Rail into the notch on the end of the shade.

Snap the Side Track Rail in place.

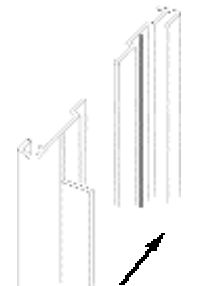
Repeat for the opposite side.



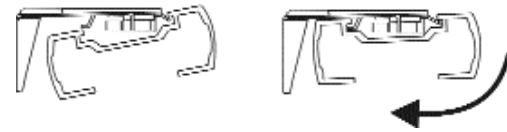
Top-Down Bottom Up

Snap the Side Track Rails into the Attachment Tracks. The notches on the Tracks must be on the top.

Unwind the cord from the shade. Release the cordlock that lowers the bottom rail (standard is the left cord). Release the opposite cordlock to lower the top.

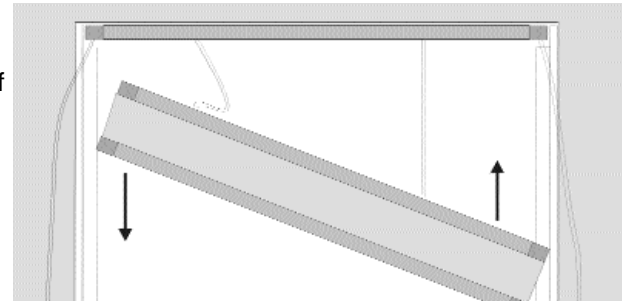


Insert the front clip of the installation bracket into the front groove of the rail.



Push the rail back and up until the back clips of the bracket are inserted in the back groove of the rail.

Tip the fabric and rails, so that you can position the groove of the fabric over the side track rail.



Level the fabric and rails.

OPERATION

Standard Shades

To lower or release shade, pull the cord inward toward the center of the shade. To raise or lock the shade, pull the cord straight down and outward toward the edge of the shade.

Top-Down Bottom Up

One cord will raise or lower the bottom rail, the other cord will raise or lower the top. Pull the cord inward toward the center of the shade to lower or release shade. Pull the cord straight down and outward toward the edge of the shade to raise or lock the shade.

Continuous Loop Shades

Operate the shade by pulling down on one side of the cord — one side of the cord raises the shade, the other side lowers the shade. Do not lift the bottom rail with your hands. Also, be careful not to place objects on the window sill that will interfere with operating the shade or cause it to hang unevenly. If the shade does become crooked, simply lower it as far as it will go and then raise it again. This will ensure that all the lift lines inside the shade are pulling up evenly.

PROTECT YOUR CHILDREN

Be aware that it is possible for children to strangle in window covering cords. To reduce the occurrence of accident, all cords must be kept out of the reach of children, including infants. Cord cleats and Tensioner Devices are effective ways to implement this essential precaution.

Standard and Top-Down Bottom Up Shades

Mount the cord cleat(s) at a safe height, taking into account furniture or other objects upon which a child may climb. Then, after each use of the shade, simply wrap the excess cord around the cleat. It's fast, easy and safe.



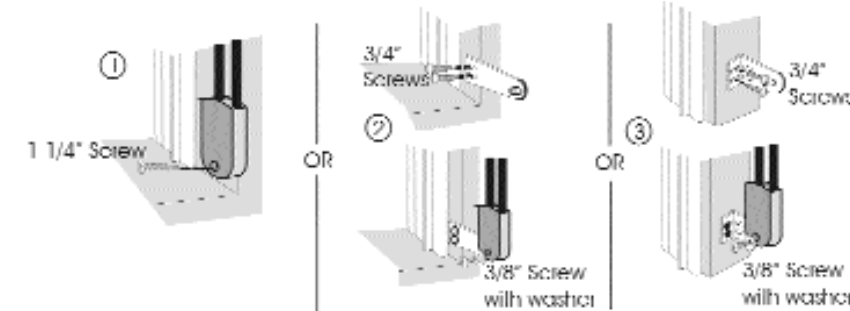
Continuous Loop Shades

The Tension Device reduces the hazards of strangulation and entanglement of young children by limiting access to the control cord. Anchor the Tension Device that is attached to the blind's control cord, to the window frame or wall, so that young children cannot pull the cord around their necks.

A. Lower the blind

B. Hold the Tension Device upright and position the Tension Device using one of the three methods shown.

C. Position the Tension Device so that the Tension Device and the control cord do not interfere with raising or lowering the blind.



- The Tension Device should be installed without stretching or pulling down on the control cord.
- Stretching the cord will cause excessive wear.
- Do not twist or cross the control cord.

TROUBLE SHOOTING

Problem: Shade is difficult to operate, especially near the top.

Cause: Brackets and Side Track may not be properly aligned.

Repair: Refer to step 2 Bracket Installation for proper alignment. Adjust brackets as necessary.

Problem: Condensation Builds up between the window and the shade.

Cause: The window is old or not sealed properly.

Repair: Allow your window to breathe by occasionally raising the shade.

Problem: Shade will not open and close properly.

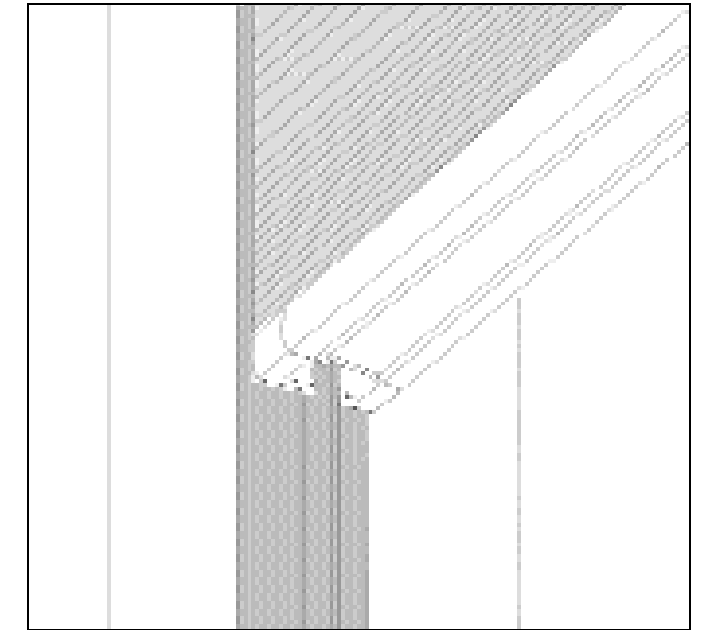
Cause: Window may not be square. The widest width of the window cannot exceed the narrowest width of the window by more than 3/8". The shade must be ordered with the narrowest measurement as the width.

Repair: Shim tracks.

CLEANING AND CARE

The Shade fabric is easy to care for. Regular dusting with a feather duster or vacuum cleaner brush is recommended. Most stains can be blotted with a damp sponge and mild detergent. For problem stains, the shade can be removed from the Installation brackets and soaked in warm water. When damp, raise shade tightly to re-crisp pleats.

Due to the superior insulation properties of this window treatment, it is sometimes possible for condensation to build up between the window and the shade. This happens most frequently when the window is old or not sealed properly. If condensation does occur, simply let your window breathe by occasionally raising the shade.
